One or more Activity Tag 2 is required if present but does not require a unit of measurement (with the exception of recreational boating facilities for the strategy of "Construction, Renovation or Acquisition"). Activity Tag 2 data is from State-based organizations (SOBA, AREA, IHEA) that have requested that certain information be collected in TRACS specific to their organizations interests. Additional Info indicates those activities where a real property or facilities information is required and/or where target species and/or habitat is required and needs to be identified.
