- It would be due 04/30/2021. You are still eligible for a one time 90 day extension in addition to that 120 days if needed. Just send in the request before the report is due like normal.

 On reporting extension requests should submit those in GS, BUT should give your grant manager or fiscal manager at WSFR an email heads-up when you submit. GS staff assignments are still wonky enough that we can't be sure we are getting all notifications.

from Shelly Allen to All Participants:

How much of an increase is expected to states? for each program? How should we get RAWA ready

from Kate Pipkin to All Participants: Is the current proposed RAWA match 75/25? ?????

from Marisa to All Participants:

Do we know the exact dates for the 2022 meeting yet? There is no specific date set at this time

from Amber Burns to All Participants:

if we want to amend a grant that started before the new regs were published to take advantage of the 120 day reporting deadline, but we don't need any change to budget or scope, how can we do that?

- from Tiffany Rollins to All Participants: Any grants that end after 11/12/2020 will automatically have final reports that are due 120 days later
- from LeAnne Bonner to All Participants: Amber, we can change any open award to a 120-day reporting period for the FINAL reports. It's just a change that WSFR has to do in GS.
- from LeAnne Bonner to All Participants: Any open SFR, WR, SWG, and S6 were changed when the default reporting cycle changes were made a couple months back. For most awards, the 120 days should already be reflected.

Hopefully ASAP will eventually change this and it the grants will be available for the 120 days to draw but for now they aren't.

Should we create new grant amendments in TRACS for open multi-year grants that were not established in TRACS initially? Or should we submit those the "old" way?

• from James Duffy to All Participants: Only grants with a start date on or after Jan 1, 2021 must go into TRACS. If your grant started before that and you need an amendment, fine to do it the old way.

from Amber Burns to All Participants:

Is there a way to run a report that show all grants?

- There maybe a report, but not guaranteed there is a report
- We do not have a canned report, the options available as a grantee are lacking, grants list can be limited to particular state, all programs, or a specific program.
